

## **Switching to a Green Energy supplier**

One of the simplest steps you can take in reducing the carbon footprint of your building is to switch to a green energy supplier.

Switching to a green energy supplier does not necessarily mean your bills will be higher. By comparing your existing price per unit of electricity with that of a company such as Good Energy, you may find that you can transfer at no extra cost.

There is an increasing number of energy supply companies offering green tariffs. However, Good Energy is at present the only UK supplier which provides 100% renewable electricity. Its energy is sourced from the natural energy of wind, sun or running water. How it works is that for every unit of electricity used by a Good Energy customer the company promises to buy an equivalent unit of electricity from a renewable source and supply this to the national grid.

The Diocese has signed an affiliation agreement with Good Energy and will receive a commission fee of £20-£120 depending on the amount consumed, for every person, parish or business that switches to Good Energy.
