A Celebration of the Nativity in Central London

On 8 December at 1pm there will be a service of dedication at St Giles-in-the-Fields. Alexandra Jay, who plays Sophie in the hit musical Mamma Mia, will be there to sing 'I Believe in Angels'. The story unfolds in a small area at the very heart of London, which becomes Bethlehem. Seven of the churches in this region are portrayed. This year the crèche can be viewed from 8-27 December and 2-6 January, Monday to Friday, 9am-4pm.
