Our Keynote Speaker – Philip Sheldrake. Philip Sheldrake is currently William Leach Professorial Fellow in Applied Theology in the Department of Theology and Religion at the University of Durham. He has most recently edited the New SCM Dictionary of Christian Spirituality and has published innumerable books and articles, most recently in the areas of sacred space and urban spirituality.
