Rhodri Clarke: was born in Porthcawl, Wales in 1980, and graduated with First Class Honours from Royal College of Music in 2004 on the Masters programme, specialising in chamber music and accompaniment. He has won major piano prizes at the National Eisteddfod of Wales, the Swansea Music Festival and the Rotary Club Young Musician of Wales. Rhodri has performed extensively as soloist and accompanist in venues such as the Wigmore Hall, Purcell Room, R.O.H. Linbury Studio, S. Martin-in-the-Fields and S. James Piccadilly. He has recently returned from a study trip in Australia working with soprano Elizabeth Donovan and accompanying her for an Opera Australia audition in Sydney.

Efrain Oscher: was born in Montevideo, Uruguay in 1974 and raised in Venezuela, where he lived until 1999. He studied music and flute at the Conservatory of Music Carabobo (Valencia-Venezuela), and is a member of the Carabobo Symphony Orchestra and solo flautist of the Valencia Municipal Orchestra. Efrain is the Flautist and Composer of the group Nuestro Ensemble which performed extensively in Venezuela. Based in Europe since 2000, Efrain has performed in venues across Germany, France, Spain, Portugal, Italy and England and in prestigious festivals like "Bath International Music Festival" and "English Chamber Orchestra Young Artist Series".
