St George's Bloomsbury is the last of the six churches designed by the leading architect of the English Baroque, Nicholas Hawksmoor. Located on Bloomsbury Way, 2 minutes walk from the British Museum; St George's was reopened to the public in October 2006 following a £9.4 million restoration funded by the Paul Mellon Estate (World Monuments Fund in Britain) and the Heritage Lottery Fund.
