Special Briefing on the Muslim Open Letter to Christian Leaders:

“A Common Word”

Friday 8 February 2008: 2.30 – 5 p.m.
(doors open at 2 p.m.)

In October 2007, 138 Muslim scholars, religious leaders and intellectuals issued a statement – “A Common Word” – declaring the common ground between Christianity and Islam. The message is addressed to leaders of the world’s Christian churches and its signatories come from all major schools of thought in Islam.

In his initial response, the Bishop of London, the Rt Rev and Rt Hon Richard Chartres, said: *“The significance of this “open letter and call” should not be underestimated.... This is a substantial letter which speaks of the unity of God from a Muslim perspective. It demands a substantial response which approaches the same theme from a Christian perspective.”*

Dr Chris Hewer, the St Ethelburga Fellow in Christian-Muslim Relations, will lead a briefing session in the Willesden Episcopal Area, at the London Inter Faith Centre, for clergy and church workers, which will cover:

- The background to the statement, its status and signatories
- Reading the text and its context
- Implications and practical suggestions for relations between Christians and Muslims in London
- Discussion of possible lines to be developed in a response.
