Whether it be a woman or girl trafficked to work in the illegal sex trade, a man forced to work on a construction site or a child married against their will, none are free. The 2019 Lent Appeal will have much more of a campaign element helping us to realise that Modern Day Slavery is happening. It has been 'hidden in plain sight' for many years but most people are unaware of it.

There are at least 40 million victims of modern day slavery in the world today; tens of thousands in the UK.

Apart from raising money to support the partner charities, we need to be able to 'spot the signs' and take action if 'something(s) not right':

Things to look out for include:

Physical Appearance

Signs of physical or psychological abuse, looking malnourished or unkempt, anxious/agitated or appearing withdrawn and neglected.

Isolation

Rarely allowed to travel on their own, seem under the control, influence of others. Rarely interact or appear unfamiliar with their neighbourhood or where they work
