Entry and timings

Please enter the Cathedral via the North West Crypt Door from 9.30 am. You will need to show your ticket to a member of staff. You will vest in the OBE Chapel. Please be vested by 10.15 am. There will be a briefing at 10.20 am in the OBE Chapel.

Vesture

Please wear black shoes if you have them:

- Clergy vesture at this service is choir habit with stole: cassock, surplice, and white stole.
- Licensed Lay Minister vesture at this service is choir habit: cassock, surplice, and blue scarf.
- Religious vesture at this service is monastic habit e.g. cassock and scapular etc.

Oils

After the Eucharist, the three Holy Oils will be distributed in the OBE Chapel. The Cathedral provides the oils in clearly marked bottles, please do not bring your own oil stocks. If you have old bottles from the Cathedral, please bring them with you – the Virgers will recycle them appropriately. Refills are available throughout the year from the Virgers, email Virgers@stpaulscathedral.org.uk to arrange this.

To avoid misuse or duplication, the oils must be collected by an Incumbent or a Priest-in-Charge. If you are sending a representative i.e. an Assistant Curate, a Churchwarden, a Pastoral Assistant etc., please provide them with a letter of permission for the Virgers to check.
