## Access Guide – Causton Street

Address: <u>London Diocesan House</u>, 36 Causton Street, London, SW1P 4AU. The entrance to the building is on Causton Street.

There is a **call button** to the left of the door, to ask reception staff to open the door (marked LDF/LDBS/GROW). The button can be reached from wheelchair height. You can also phone reception on **020 7932 1100**.

There is flat access into the building, on a slight slope. There are double doors which can both be opened.

There is a **platform lift** just inside the building. It is to the right of the stairs. It can be used independently. The platform lift goes to reception level.

When you exit the platform lift, go straight on, into the corridor. There is a **lift** on the left. There is a **fold-down seat** beside the lift. The lift is large enough for one wheelchair user.

For the main hall take the lift to **Floor 2**.

There is a spiral staircase with a handrail, for those who do not need to use the lift.

## Finding the Event Room

The main meeting hall is **Second Floor Meeting Room** on Floor 2.

On Floor 2, **turn left** out of the lift. Follow the corridor all the way around to the end. The Second Floor Meeting Room is at the **end of the corridor**.

You will pass through one door in the corridor. Doors are not automatic. They will be pinned open. Corridors are wide enough for a wheelchair user to navigate.

## Second Floor Meeting Room

The room has a door wide enough for most wheelchair users. There are recycling bins in the corridor outside the room. The door will be pinned open in between sessions.

Chairs are padded but they do not have arms. Please let us know if you need a chair with arms and we can arrange for one to be brought up.

There is a **large screen** at the front of the room where slides can be projected.

There is good **natural light** in the room. There is **up-lighting** on the walls, as well as **overhead lighting**. During training sessions, it is possible to only use the up-lighting. In group work sessions, we can turn on all lights, if requested. If you find the lighting difficult at any time please do tell us.

There is a door at the front of the room that leads out to three individual toilets (gender neutral). The accessible toilets are in the corridors by the lift (see below).

## Accessible Toilets

There are accessible toilets **by the lifts on every floor** including Floor 2. There is another accessible toilet in **reception.** There are individual (gender neutral) toilets beside them. Toilet doors are not heavy. Accessible toilets meet basic accessibility standards.

Public transport

The nearest tube station is Pimlico on the Victoria line. Access to and from the platforms requires the use of escalators and fixed stairs. The nearest step-free station is Victoria underground (district, circle, Victoria line) plus mainline station, then a walk or bus (nos, 36, 185) along Vauxhall Bridge Road. Or underground or mainline train to Vauxhall then walk or bus (nos, 36, 88, 185). Also buses from central London eg Westminster (87, 88).
