w, r - for Lesser Festivals the colour is indicated in lower case and (**w**), (**r**) if BCP

Between **ALL SAINTS' DAY** and **The First Sunday in Advent**, Green may be used instead of Red. Red may be used for Ember Days.

4. Lesser Festivals and *Commemorations* which fall on a **PRINCIPAL FEAST**, a **PRINCIPAL HOLY DAY**, a **Sunday**, or during **Holy Week** and **Easter Week** are listed in brackets in smaller type, but will not be observed this year.
